Jake Galloway is the son of Andy and Nicole Galloway. His older sister Hanna and his older brother Chase, a 2016 graduate of GWHS, live in College Station. Jake moved to George West in August before his 8th grade year from Decatur, Texas.

As George West High School's valedictorian, Jake earned a grade point average of 106.04.

In addition to his high–achieving academics, he is an NHS member and served as Student Council president this year. Jake was a class officer all four years of high school serving as Senior Class president. As a freshman and sophomore, Jake competed in UIL Mathematics and was active in FFA. He advanced to the state UIL Mathematics competition his freshman year while advancing to the regional competition his sophomore year. He

also served as FFA Parliamentarian his sophomore year.





Thank you, teacher

Encourage your youngster to decide how she wants to thank her teacher for a great year. Maybe she'll make a card that tells what she liked best. ("The engineering projects were cool. I really had fun building a bridge.") She can hand-deliver the card along with a homemade gift, perhaps a bird feeder or a pencil jar.

Middle school ahead

Do you have a child moving on to middle school? He will feel more confident if he knows what to expect. Make sure he attends orientation, where he'll meet staff and begin to learn his way around. He might also ask older kids for advice about getting from one class to another on time or finding a seat in the cafeteria.

Happy parent, happy child

A happy parent equals a happier household. To increase your family's overall happiness, try to find time every day to do something that pleases you. Examples: enjoy a hobby, spend time with a friend, read a book.

Explore the outdoors

From sunny mornings when dew sparkles on the grass to dark nights when stars appear in the sky, the great outdoors is the perfect summer "classroom" for your child. Enjoy these activities together to help him appreciate nature and learn more about it.



Have your youngster put together an outdoor exploration kit. He could fill

a shoebox or a reusable grocery bag with a magnifying glass for examining bugs, binoculars for gazing at constellations, and a sketch pad and colored pencils for drawing and labeling what he sees. Let him use his kit all summer long in your backyard, at the park, or on hikes.

Count collections

Encourage your child to gather leaves, nuts, seeds, and other objects from the ground. He'll practice math skills as he counts, sorts, and graphs his "finds." He might make a pictograph to compare the number of seeds, nuts, and leaves he collected. *Idea*: Suggest that he research his discoveries in nature guides and display his collection with facts on index cards. ("A sweetgum ball is the fruit of a sweetgum tree.")

Take poetry walks

Go on poetry walks. Your youngster can jot down notes on what he sees, hears, feels, and smells. Perhaps he'll walk barefoot across damp grass, sniff a patch of honeysuckle, or run his hand over the bark of a tree. Then, he could use his notes to write a poem, such as:

Dew is cool under my bare feet The honeysuckle smells so sweet.♥

Celebrate learning

Let your child know how proud you are of her efforts this school year by holding a learning celebration. Here are suggestions:

- Be your youngster's audience as she reads aloud stories or reports she wrote. Asking questions will show you're interested.
- Help your child make a hallway gallery of her artwork. Hang up favorite pieces, and invite family members to take a tour.
- Show her all the progress she has made! Pull out samples of her homework or projects from early in the year. She will enjoy seeing how much she has learned and improved.♥

The top two places advanced to Nationals, thus George West advanced five teams to the National Conference in Nashville, TN this July. These students were competing against students from all over the state of Texas from 1A to 6A schools. Harleigh Goebel created a hypothetical business called "The Travellin' Paintbrush." She had to research everything in the business structure from obtaining start up finances, legal forms, hiring and firing, safety regulations and budget planning. Parker Lee and Mollee Herrmann both investigated a career that aligned with their skills and aptitudes. Parker chose Physical Therapy where she researched job responsibilities, course requirements, aptitudes and even shadowed Dusty Soliz at Momentum Fitness to research the career. Mollee researched similar requirements for a career in Wildlife Biology. She is even currently participating in an internship at the San Antonio Zoo to further her career interests. Madison Gass chose to "Stand Against Stigma" of mental disorders. She presented to several groups to bridge the communication gap and educate others about the dangers of stigma associated with mental illness. Kayla Brown and Taylor Terry enlisted the help of the community to clean up and advertise our local animal shelter. They volunteered their time to spend with the animals, helped clean up the shelter and hosted a donation drive for pet supplies. Lauren Carroll created a professional portfolio to interview for a career in human resources. She also practiced her job interview skills with current human resources manager Debbie Trinidad and Christina Ponce at Valero Refinery, Denise Garza at South Trust Bank and Amy Rhodes of Capital Group. Sahara Wills and Caroline Davis showcased the activities our chapter has completed this year with George West FCCLA. They chose a movie theme to highlight all the numerous activities and created an impressive display.
