We have much to be proud of in George West. Our schools and our students have developed a reputation over the years for quality and success. This reputation results from many years of hard work and dedication by the educators in George West. It is also a direct reflection of the great community that has supported our schools and our educators.

Recently, I witnessed another great example of selfless support for our schools. A few months back, a small group of parents and students approached the district to offer their support in cleaning up the surplus furniture, equipment and materials that had accumulated at our district ag farm. I have to admit being a little skeptical about the group's motivation when they first made their request. In the end, however, the best part of this story relates to their incentive behind the offer. According to these parents, the cleanup work was simply being done to help the school which educates their children. Their pride in our George West schools and their sense of duty to something bigger than themselves was the motivation behind the offer to help out and give back. Even more importantly, they saw the project as a great opportunity to share something with their children that could instill these values for the future.

In the end, these volunteers spent multiple weeks working after school and on weekends to dismantle, sort, and haul off multiple loads of metal and other scrap materials to recyclers in Beeville and Alice. All proceeds from the sales were returned and donated to the district at the April school board meeting. The attached photos shows representative parents and students being recognized by school staff and board members.

The willingness of these parents and their children to help out in this positive way is a testament to what makes us successful in everything we do at George West ISD. Rather than just pointing out an issue, they came with a solution. As superintendent, I am proud to be associated with a community that does so much to support our schools.


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## GEORGE WEST EDUCATION FOUNDATION

Only three years ago, our community established the George West Education Foundation, a private foundation designed to support teachers and students in George West ISD. This year, the Foundation raised over \$150,000 to put back into the classroom.

The individuals on the GWEF Board are committed to doing what they can to support their school and community. Hours of hard work go into planning fund raisers and the management and selection of the grants.

To receive a grant, teachers must complete an application documenting the purpose and expenses involved. In April, the GWEF awarded grants totaling just over $\$ 155,000$. The grants ranged from training to conventions to technology for the classroom. It was a wonderful day. The Foundation Board, the students, and the teachers were so very excited when the grant recipients were announced!

Projects funded by the Board include library books, field trips to the San Antonio Children's Museum and the Witte Museum, novels for the high school English department, Family and Consumer Science instructional materials and supplies, travel expenses for FFA, BPA, and TARC Rocket Team. Additionally, the GWEF funded technology projects including notebook computers for the first grade, laptops for band, laptops for the high school science department, and Mimio boards and cameras for some teachers.

George West ISD is so very grateful for this incredible avenue of support for our teachers and students.
